We welcome Kerry to Corrigan Park today for a key championship clash for both of our counties. Winning today's game is crucial to success in the Championship for both teams, and both counties continued interest in the GAA season rests on hurling. There was not much between our two teams in the National League final and we expect as tough a contest today.

Whilst we both have aspirations to play at Croke Park on All Ireland Sunday at the end of the season, it would be remiss of me not to applaud the efforts of our county footballers this year. We were cruelly close to promotion yet again, with a single point in our drawn match against Carlow, being the thin margin between promotion and division 4. We performed in the championship last week, away in Cavan, against a strong Cavan team who had defeated Monaghan from division 1 the week before. A lung bursting run from Patrick Gallagher deserved a goal, if not a penalty, and the game could have been so different. Those are the fine margins in representative sport, and we are proud of the effort of the entire panel.

I want to pay particular respect to managerial tenure of Lenny Harbinson. Lenny has been one of the most faithful servants of the GAA in Antrim, having distinguished himself as a player with club and county and then as manager with his club St Gall's. There aren't many managers of All Ireland winning calibre in Antrim. He leaves us having given us his best and having established strong cultures and habits which will no doubt lead to success in the future, and when it happens we will reflect on the direct positive effect that Lenny has had on Antrim football.

Our attention for the rest of the season rests solely with the hurlers. The never say die attitude which has been hard wired into the team's psychology was evident again in our last outing against Carlow, reminiscent of our last second goal against Offaly to gain a crucial point in the league. We did not stop until the final whistle, again demonstrating the strength in depth of our bench, with the final two scores being much needed goals coming from Domhnall Nugent and James McNaughton, who came off the bench proving the adage that the finishing 15 is as important as the starting 15. Our strength in depth was demonstrated in our last home game against Westmeath which we started without 3 of our 5 top scorers from the league, minus 6.72 from a league haul of 13.100! Our 19 point win, from our 4.25 set a new record winning margin for the Joe McDonagh competition.

Many thanks again to the Club Aontroma team that prepare our programs for our games, a much appreciated contribution to the enjoyment of match day for players and spectators alike. These programs are only feasible with the crucial contributions from the sponsors and we urge all our spectators to support these sponsors in what are exceptionally difficult times for all businesses. Club Aontroma will be inviting interest for sponsors for the 2021 season of programs, which will be exceptionally interesting as we look forward to hosting Clare, Wexford and Laois next year, hopefully with live crowds supporting the team. <mark>CLUB FOCUS</mark> PÁDRAIG SÁIRSÉIL CLG



Pádraig Sáirséil CLG was established in October in 1906 has since then been an integral part of the GAA community in Irelands second city. During this time the Pádraig Sáirséil brand has been synonymous with the promotion sports, language and culture and has been at the centre of the thriving GAA community in West Belfast for the last 114 years.

The club house was originally situated in Dover street in the lower falls area of Belfast but was burnt the ground by a loyalist mob during the 1969 programs in Belfast. This event and the beginning of the conflict in the North didn't



stop the committee at that time from working with the Corporation to rent premises in Divis Street and we carried on from these premises until May '74.

Homeless after seventy years the Pádraig Sáirséil CLG negotiated a lease of part of the available Shaws Road complex in 1978. During this period Club stalwarts and volunteers showed great commitment and determination and not only continued to field teams but resituated to a fantastic site in Stewartstown avenue to what is known by many as 'The Bearpit'

In 2011, Pádraig Sáirséil CLG was faced with another crisis due to significant financial pressures which could ultimately have resulted in the club ceasing to exist. However, the same spirt and resilience that was shown by the Men and women from the Dover street era was reimagined. The hard work and dedication of our members, families and friends not only averted a dire situation but it sparked the revival of the one of oldest clubs in the city of Belfast.

9 years on from this the club is a thriving and successful entity on the pitch and also in terms of its governance arrangements and management structures.

Due to adopting a community development approach Pádraig Sáirséil CLG has become a hub for the wider community. Pádraig Sáirséil CLG undergone a renaissance and has been able to identify and deliver on various considerable improvement projects. These include new changing rooms, 4g training pitch, Floodlights and ball wall area, upgraded community hall, member's gym, a new roof and upgraded seating and car parking areas at the hub.

Our commitment to working in partnership with local schools and community groups has helped us develop new relationships and seen our premises and site being utilised in more imaginative and diverse ways.

Due to these partnerships and with the help of our local political representatives, we have raised significant funds and obtained grant assistance to allow the Club to invest nearly ${\tt f1m}$ on our site.

The investment in the Pádraig Sáirséil had the desired effect of attracting more people and families and we have witnessed an exponential growth in terms of new members both at Senior and Juvenile levels. Success for Pádraig Sáirséil CLG is supporting the hundreds of children now playing for us and witnessing them developing as young Gaels, playing their national sport, using their 'Cúpla Focal 'and



enjoying healthy and positive experiences at the Bear pit.

The older generations are valued greatly within The Pádraig Sáirséil family also and through the establishment of a very successful men's shed we have been able to entice older member to return and carry out the maintenance of the site while enjoying the social aspect and comradery that is often lost when men retire from work.

Some of the various activities that the Mens Shed group undertake include: repair of hurls, environmental/ horticultural work, maintenance of the grass and 4G pitches, servicing and maintenance of the pitch and upkeep of machinery, ongoing routine site maintenance of the all club facilities, various other DIY and craftwork. The Mens shed group were awarded grant funding for a new £10,000 premises within the Pádraig Sáirséil Community Hub in October 2020

Since March 2020 the Pádraig Sáirséil membership have risen to the societal

challenges of the pandemic and have worked in partnership with community organisations to keep food banks stocked, raise money and check in with Vulnerable and people who may be at risk of feeling isolated during the lockdowns.

Ultimately we love to see our sports being played and enjoyed and have In recent years, seen success on the field with both our male and female teams at juvenile and senior levels. The highlight was in 2017 when we won both the immediate hurling and junior football championships in Antrim.

Padraig Sairseil has evolved and responded to the needs of the local community. Our rich GAA heritage is now impacting positively on a much greater number of people. We hope that this hard work will result in more success on the pitch and greater representation on the county panels. Our legacy shall be the continued provision of GAA in West Belfast for another 114 years and beyond.










